Tragedies Caesar lines by act

2451 total lines

shorter than the average (average play: 2768; average tragedy (2938)

Act Two, Scene Three, and Act Five, Scene Two are the shortest of their kind in the Canon (16 and 6 lines respectively)

Act One: 561lines

shorter than average (average play: 582, average tragedy: 660)

Act Two: 526 lines

shorter than average play (average play: 567, average tragedy: 606)

Act Three: 602 lines

longer than average play (576), but shorter than the average tragedy (644)

Act Four: 409 lines

MUCH shorter than average (average play: 560, average tragedy: 547)

Act Five: 353 lines

the shortest of all tragedies; much shorter than average (average play: 484, average tragedy: 478)






